Member of the Committee on Civic Liberties and Internal Affairs, the Sub-Committee on Human Rights and the EC-Turkey Joint Parliamentary Committee, of which she was elected deputy chairperson. She also remained involved with the foreign policy committee as a substitute member.

She became a member of the Committee on the Affairs of the European Union and a substitute member of the Committee on Internal Affairs of the German Bundestag.

Additionally she was elected chairperson of the new parliamentary commission on Human Rights and Humanitarian Aid (until 2001).
